Grace Wilson Melvin was born in Glasgow, Scotland. She graduated with honours from the Glasgow School of Art in 1918. After further study and scholarships in London and Paris, she joined the staff of the Glasgow School of Art, becoming head of the lettering and illumination section. She won the Lauder Prize for decorative art from the Glasgow Society of Lady Artists in 1927. She exhibited her work at the Royal Scottish Academy, at the National Gallery of Canada between 1928 and 1934, and with the [Royal Canadian Academy](#) in 1932.

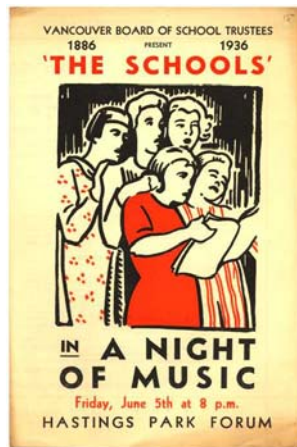


In 1927 she was "loaned" to the [Vancouver School of Decorative and Applied Arts](#) for a year. At the end of the year, she declined to return to Scotland, instead staying in Vancouver and becoming Head of the Department of Design for the VSDAA. She also taught Lettering and Illumination, Embroidery, and Pottery.

Interestingly, she exhibited her artwork in the 1922 annual exhibition of the [B.C. Society of Fine Arts](#), a few years before moving here. This would likely have been arranged by Charles Scott. Melvin also exhibited with the BCSFA from 1936 to 1962, 1966, and in the final BCSFA exhibition in 1967.

In 1927 she exhibited an illumination with the [Island Arts and Crafts Society](#). In 1928 she wrote an article titled *Pattern* for the third edition of *The Paint Box*, the art school's annual. The article was illustrated with woodcuts by [Ada Currie](#), one of the school's students.

Melvin exhibited in the annual *B.C. Artists* exhibitions at the [Vancouver Art Gallery](#) in the inaugural show in 1932, also 1933, 1955 to 1958, 1960, and 1961.

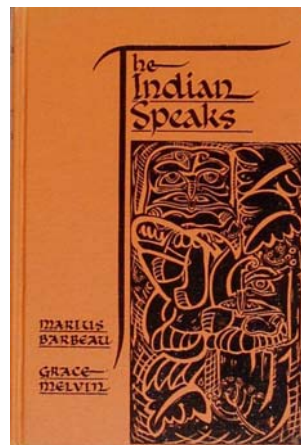


The Spring 1936 edition of *The Smock Pocket*, the Vancouver School of Art Graduates' Association newsletter, noted that she was one of three jurors for the association's Fourth Annual Exhibition.

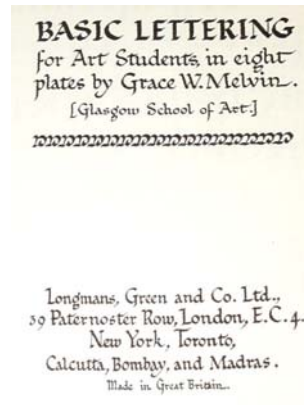


She donated artwork to an FCA fundraising exhibition for the Canadian Red Cross at the Vancouver Art Gallery in 1942.

Melvin illustrated *The Indian Speaks* for Marius Barbeau in 1943, and achieved national notice. Her solo exhibition at the Vancouver Art Gallery in 1943 consisted of 42 illustrations for the book.



She also wrote books on lettering and design, including *Structure of Design and Colour* and *Lettering for Artists and Art Students*, published for the Department of Education at the University of British Columbia. She also did a series of cards for lettering titled *Basic Lettering for Art Students*, published by Longmans, Green & Co. in England. She was the editor for a book titled *Applied Art Home Economics* published in 1940 by the B.C. Department of Education in Victoria, B.C.



On January 25, 1947 she gave a lecture titled *Color in the Home* under the auspices of the [Vancouver Institute](#).

She submitted three ink drawings to the 1949 *B.C. Graphic* exhibition at the [Vancouver Art Gallery](#), two of them were selected for the exhibition.



She was an outstanding illustrator and calligrapher, and illustrated the Book of Remembrance for the Canadian Engineers for World Wars I and II, which is housed in St. Paul's Cathedral, London.

In 1961 a short [artist summary](#) on Melvin's personal letterhead was provided to the Vancouver Art Gallery.

Melvin's contribution to the arts in Vancouver and Canada was substantial, and her work was widely exhibited in her lifetime, and is in many major collections, yet she remains one of the lesser known artists of Western Canada. She died in 1977 at the age of eighty-four, according to data from B.C. Archives Vital Statistics.
